


## City of Gonzales 2022 Fall Reuse, Recycle & Cleanup Day Report

November 16, 2022

On November 12, 2022, the City of Gonzales held its fall community cleanup day event at Fairview Middle School. The event was advertised to residential utility customers through social media and mailers.



The flow of traffic by participants was steady. CalTrans staff tracked the number of participants at 165 vehicles. Fairview Middle School continues to be an ideal location to maintain a safe and visible community event.

The event provides landfill disposal vouchers for refrigerators and freezers at the Johnson Canyon Landfill. Volunteers benefit from being able to direct participants to the nearby landfill to dispose of bulky items such as mattresses and appliances. Rather than unload them into dumpsters, residents can easily push them off into landfill collection piles.

The event focuses on preventing illegal dumping and helping residents "clear the clutter." It facilitates source separation,

recycling, and proper disposal of hazardous waste, trash, appliances, mattresses, scrap metal, rigid plastics, cardboard, and electronic waste.

The event was sponsored by a DOT/Caltrans "Clean California Dump Day" grant. The grant covered the city's landfill disposal fees and professional staff time for Tri-Cities and Salinas Valley Recycles. This partnership allows Caltrans District 5 to do outreach to further our shared goals of eliminating littering and illegal dumping.

The free "Take it or Leave it" area continues to be a big hit with the community. As anyone who has participated in these events knows, the reuse area has many great finds. Most of our adult volunteers were surprised to find many useful items for themselves! The event accepts donations for the clothing closet at the Gonzales Community Presbyterian Church. Blankets and towels are separated and delivered to South County Animal Rescue, where they are needed to care for rescued animals.

A team from Save the Whales was on site to conduct surveys and educate the community about protecting against stormwater contamination. After their outreach, the team conducted a litter cleanup between Fairview and La Gloria schools.

Residents received free and safe disposal of ABOP (Antifreeze, Batteries, Oil, and Paint) materials and sharps containers through Salinas Valley Recycles. Monterey County Environmental Health coordinated a CalRecycle grant-funded oil filter exchange program and provided free oil collection containers.

The Gonzales High School Cross Country and Track teams provided 84 volunteer hours. This group consistently meets its commitments with enthusiastic volunteers who exemplify the spirit of community service. Tri-Cities provided gloves, safety vests, lunch, and ice water. The group will receive a \$500 donation from Tri-Cities Disposal & Recycling.
